A Life Touched by Christ's Loving Hand

It was approximately three years ago. I was going through a divorce and was struggling with my faith, life as a single person after close to 15 years, and life as a single mom of two girls. I was not raised in any particular religion, but always believed in God, never really understanding what it meant to have a God but knowing it was something good. I remember going to Whispering Winds to a Mom's Retreat Weekend. I was scared, excited and totally apprehensive and not sure why. Perhaps because I knew there was something there I would find, that I've been searching for.

We arrived at Whispering Winds, got settled in and prepared for a really great weekend. I found myself somewhat emotional as I arrived, unsure why and still somewhat afraid. I got through Friday night pretty well, realized there was an amazing group of women in front of me, all of whom were very comfortable with their faith, boy did I envy them. I think I was the only divorced one there, which made me feel odd, but I got over that pretty quickly. Saturday morning came, we had a delicious breakfast and talked about how gorgeous the grounds were, for me it was my first time so I was anxious to get out and look around. There was a fire that spared the grounds recently, and it was amazing to see the areas that were spared.

Saturday night came and it was time to get together to listen to the speaker. This is when things changed for me; this is what I think I was afraid of. I remember being in the small room, there were probably 30 of us and we were all listening to this woman talk about being a mom, I heard stories from other women about their lives and I felt my defense crumbling inside of me. I was actually feeling the presence of God, I felt Him tell me it was okay to feel what I was feeling, to let it go and finally be free of my fear. I felt the tears hitting my cheeks as we did our group sessions and I had to get up and leave. I will never, as long as I live forget the walk up the path from the small hall to the building where we were staying. It was October so the air was crisp, the sky was fairly clear. I was walking and I could not catch my breath, it was not from being out of shape but because I was actually feeling what it is like to begin to have a relationship with Christ, and to finally let go and let Him guide me. I asked God to hold my hand, he did. I remember as I crested the small hill, tears streaming down my cheeks as I told the Lord I cannot do this alone anymore, nor did I want to. I cried like a child as I asked him to hold me, and I felt Him there. It was the most amazing thing I've ever felt. I don't know that I can put what transpired that night, into words.

I think Kate knew I was in a transitional place. She came to the room to be with me. We talked for a very long time, I cried and cried, letting it all go. I'm sure I was babbling like a fool, but all the while she knew it was part of my growth, part of my finding God and understanding it.

I left Whispering Winds a changed person. Every time someone mentions that place, I feel tears in my eyes, I am so thankful for the experience and so thankful to have been part of it. I've been back a few times, I always want to cry out of sheer gratitude. The Lord touched my life that weekend. He drew me in and he held me close. He showed me a safety I've never known before. Since then I've continued my relationship with the Lord, and I'm evolving daily because of it.
