I immediately noticed the difference as dirt was getting in the shoes due to all the holes and I could feel the rocks through the worn soles. at every Family Camp for the last several years. My subconscious knew this was a worthwhile investment, as he represents a true Super Hero at Whispering Winds. I Remember When...



Sister Mary Marshall was about 82 years old when she visited Whispering Winds for the first time. She had a bubbly personality, always had a smile on her face and did not wear the traditional garb of the Order of Sisters.

At that time we had several aqua-marine colored "outhouses" around the camp. Sister asked me what the blue buildings were. I told her that they were outhouses. She asked what outhouses were. I explained they were little restrooms and asked if she'd ever used one. She said that she didn't get out much, and wondered what people did in the buildings. I continued to explain that they were used as little bathrooms where people did their business. Of course she asked, "What kind of business?" I finally said, "There is a toilet and a urinal in each building". Sister asked if she could use one sometime, to which I said, "Sure, that's what they're for!"

The next morning as people were waiting nearby in line for breakfast, she came out of one of the outhouses and exclaimed in a loud voice, "THESE THINGS ARE WONDERFUL! YOU HAVE A PLACE TO SIT DOWN AND ANOTHER PLACE TO PUT YOUR PURSE!" Everyone had good laugh and Sister joined in the laughter too.





More than 100 children running around camp with smiles wide and broad were found at Whispering Winds during the first weekend of August. Camp Connect brought siblings in the foster care system together for a special retreat, some of the family members reuniting for the first time in years.

Camp Connect is a project of Promises2Kids, which supports abused and underserved kids in San Diego. Through Camp Connect, brothers and sisters separated in foster care have opportunities throughout the year to reconnect, strengthen family ties and create lasting childhood memories. Whispering Winds was the place for that special reunion from August 4-7.

Thankfully, a grant provided by the Philip Rivers Foundation helped make the event a reality. More than 50 volunteers facilitated team building games, arts and crafts, music and entertainment, swimming, nature activities and the challenge course that were all a part of this unique mountain get-away.

One of the young campers said, "we learned how to work together and ask for help when we needed it."
