Knock, Knock. Who's there? Merci. Mercy who? Merci beaucoup!

A silly play on words, however I am very thankful for God's blessings and grace on the journey. As I reflect on the past year, pray about my New Year's Resolutions and the invitation Pope Francis extended to be the face of Christ in our church's Year of Mercy.

Christmas Eve at Midnight mass, this servant sister was at St. Patrick's Cathedral in New Orleans, Louisiana The lights in the church were dimmed to candlelight and Mass began with the priest proclaiming the Birth of Christ, then picking up a life size statue of the baby Jesus that was at the foot of a statue of the Blessed Mother. The choir was singing Silent Night in German as he raised the infant high in the air and processed behind six altar servers carrying lanterns up and down the main isles of the church until he reached the crèche in front of the church on the opposite side where he began. He passed the infant to a young perisher, about four years old and was also part of the procession, to be place in the crib. All the lights in the church came on and the congregation sang O Come, All Ye Faithful. The impact of going from dark to light was very symbolic. I was moved to reflect on the path we take as Christians to be the light of Christ.

The dictionary gives four simple noun descriptors for the word mercy: compassion, compassionate disposition, something to be thankful for, and easing of distress. This is clearly our Heavenly Father and his action towards us.. In Psalm 103 we hear these words: "The Lord is kind and merciful. Slow to anger, rich in kindness, the Lord is kind and merciful. Bless the Lord, O my soul; all my being bless Gods name. Bless the Lord, O my soul; forget not all Gods blessings. The Lord is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, full of kindness. God is good to all creation, full of compassion. The goodness of God is from age to age, blessing those who choose to love. And justice toward God's children; on all who keep the covenant." St. Ignatius says that love shows itself better in deeds than in words. What are some concrete ways I can show my love in my daily living?

One of my New Year's Resolutions is to exercise not only physically but spiritually. It became very clear to me that St. Ignatius exercise of the Daily Examen is the best practice to discern God's direction. The Examen is an ancient practice in the church that can help us see God's hand at work in our whole experience. The Daily Examen is a prayerful reflection in order to detect God's presence and discern his direction for me.

There are five simple steps that I will share and invite you to go to **loyolapress.com** for more detail.

STILLNESS-Recalling God's presence. Relax in God's presence, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. What draws me close or pulls me away from Him?

GRATITUDE-expressing thankfulness. Recall the gifts that God has given me to share with others and express my gratitude.

REFLECT-Look back on you day. Recall feeling and motives to see whether I considered all of the possibilities and freely followed God's will. Reflect on the times I did or didn't act with God's grace.

SORROW- Asking for Forgiveness. Express sorrow for the times I failed to follow His direction and ask the Holy Spirit to be with me next time I encounter a similar situation. Feel sorrow and gratitude in your heart as you converse with God.

HOPEFULNESS-RESOLVING TO GROW- Resolve to cooperate and trust in the loving guidance of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit as you look forward to a new day.

Pope Francis has declared this to be the Jubilee Year of Mercy. What will this look like for you? Catholiccompany.com, gifted author, Gretchen Filz has a few suggestions in her article 8 "New Year Spiritual Resolutions". I hope you will check it out as we prepare for our New Year at Whispering Winds Camp and grow as Women of God.

New Year - New Changes to Membership

The auxiliary was asked earlier last year to move our finances from a fiscal year - July 1 -June 30th to the a calendar year - January to December to be in line with Whispering Winds.

The WWWA board recommended that we change the dates for membership. The board proposed that dues be due January 1st and membership in the auxiliary runs January through December. To accomplish this, any dues paid from May 2015 and forward will be good through December of 2016. At the Annual Meeting and Brunch this past November, the attending members were asked to vote and the proposal was approved. Annual membership for the Auxiliary is now January through December. If you have not paid dues since May 2015, they are due now. Membership is \$30 for the year or \$200 for life membership. 
