

Come to Me

I am just coming off a three-day silent retreat at the Carmelites retreat center in Alhambra. For those of you who know me, staying silent from Friday evening until Sunday midday was a challenge.

When my friend Barbara invited me to share this weekend. I responded with I will pray about it. I wanted to go but I was busy.

The next day in my prayer corner our Lord sent a second invitation when I was reading the In Conversation with God. The reading focused on the silence of Mary. F. Suarez wrote this analogy. "Silence is an indispensable condition for keeping things and pondering them in one's heart. Profundity of thought can develop only in a climate of silence. Too much chatter exhausts our inner strength: it dissipates everything of value in our heart, which becomes like a bottle of perfume left open for a long time: only water remains with a slight touch of its former fragrance." Further reading invoked the importance of formation of our interior soul and the value of nurturing this through silent retreats along with visits to adoration.

The following day I was driving and on Immaculate Heart radio the speaker was sharing his experience of a silent retreat in Northern California. Spending time with God and nature, stepping away from the business and noise of daily living. He shared the value of taking time to listen to God.

I finally responded to God's invitation to come to Him. When I called there were only two spaces left on the retreat.

When I arrived on retreat my room was in Our Lady's Wing and my room was Our Lady of Fatima. Our retreat Master was also speaking about the Mercy and Grace of Fatima. The peace and joy I experienced on this weekend was profound.

I learned once again that God knows what I need if I am obedient to His will, not mine.

As we enter this busy season of Advent I encourage you to take time to sit quietly with the Lord. Maybe He has been inviting you to do something and you have not said yes yet.

This beautiful sister-in-Christ is always ready to join in with her servants' heart and hands on any project for the Auxiliary. Her reliance and trust in the Lord leads her to creatively and humbly be available for the task at hand. While working beside her we find the light of Christ evident in her joyful attitude. Our Woman of the Year comes to this honor from a wealth of experience and a varied background. We have been blessed to enjoy her talents for many years and have come to rely on her often, her gifts to the Auxiliary are indispensable.

What path did our Woman of the Year follow that brought her to us – She was born August 9, 1964 in York, PA. She attended Northeastern H.S. where she played the flute in the marching band. She grew up across the street from a dairy farm & was always comfortable with & loved animals. She met her husband in the early 80's, they dated for a couple of years & were married in Norfolk, VA. In 1987. As a Navy wife she held the 'hardest job in the Navy', raising their two sons, Charles & Zachary while her husband was deployed on submarines. She volunteered at St. Pius X in Norfolk where their sons attended school, and most people thought she was dedicated Catholic. Then it was off to Naples, Italy for a 3 year assignment and finally back to San Diego. They settled in Jamul & registered at St. Pius X, there she felt 'there was something special about this little church'. It was here that our woman of the year made the decision to become Catholic. She attended RCIA while her husband was away on his final deployment, when he returned they were married in the Catholic Church by Fr. Scott Burnia, 15 years to the day from their civil marriage!

In Sept. 2009 she suffered a horrific broken neck injury in a life threatening automobile accident, she persevered 3 surgeries and a lengthy painful recovery. She felt truly blessed throughout the ordeal and is a walking miracle, she often says the accident was the worst & best day of her life. This trial lead her to develop a deeper relationship with Jesus, to become involved in faith based activities & organizations where she generously volunteers her time. The Holy Spirit is clearly alive and working through her, we are all blessed to have her in our lives, please welcome our 2018 WOTY – Tammy Sue Knapp!
