However, the paper is brittle so I must have found it years ago. I pray it often and it has helped me get through these dark days with peace and a bit of joy.

Prayer of Surrender

We are a hopeful community of women, keeping our focus on Christ. Ask for the grace to respond NOW to those in need. They could be family members, neighbors, elderly in your parish, children at home trying to learn via Zoom whose parents know very little about the internet. AND PRAY, PRAY, PRAY about and for everyone and everything.

"Then you will call upon me and come and pray to me, and I will hear you." Jeremiah 29:12. On that note, did you know that our Auxiliary is praying the rosary together via Zoom every Tuesday evening at 7pm? Please join us—the link and password are below.

After all these years, I recently learned something new about the rosary from Father Don Calloway's book, *Champions of the Rosary*. The second half of the Hail Mary prayer did not appear until the fourteenth century during the Black Death pandemic, which wiped out one third of Europe. That second part of the prayer: "Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death", was added as an outcry from the people to Mary to protect them at a time when the present moment and death were almost one. I wonder how many sick with Covid or their family members feel that same desperation?

Since the Churches are re-opening, we, gratefully, are able to receive Sacramental Eucharist instead of Spiritual Communion. Our sacramental life is restored and we continue our prayer for our members and Whispering Winds Catholic Camp at 3:00 pm every day.

Andi's job is to send out personal notes from our WWWA Board of sympathy, "get well" or "thank you" to our members and supporters. It allows her to make a connection and offer love and grace. Previously she served on the Whispering Winds camp board and was encouraged by Denise Casinelli and Chris Villalobos to join our group. Her servant heart radiates in all areas of her life. She has been married to husband Tom for She and Tom have 4 beautiful children: daughters Avery, Lindsey, and Shelby along with son, Jacob. Avery recently gave birth to little Ruby and

Lindsey, baby Adelaide. Her family is a sense of pride, love and commitment that is evident in the way her voice picks ups at the mention of their name. Growing up in Oklahoma, her greatest role model was her grandmother Lorene, because of the way she tirelessly and compassionately took care of others, never complaining. Andi attended college at Louisiana Tech on a softball scholarship, playing 2nd base. If you follow softball, you would know that a 2nd base player has to be quick, alert, agile and flexible. They have somewhere to be on every single play, either backing up someone, or being an essential player, like turning double play. It makes perfect sense that Andi would find this spot a comfortable place to excel. While in college she got a job This would set her course towards a working with disabled children. nursing degree and draw her into serving families with special needs. Andi is a registered nurse for Friendship Development Services, serving close to 100 clients, responsible for 18 personally. A turning point for Andi was her conversion from being a good nurse, to being a Godly nurse. She attributes this change to Cursillo as it gave her a new view on life. Her father-in-law, Marvin Finch, long time Cursillista, was instrumental in showing Andi and Tom how to live a Christ filled life. They have honored him by doing the same for their children. All Finch family members are frequent volunteers at the Family Camp and especially, the Specials Needs Family Camp. They have filled many roles including CCA's, camp nurse, special buddies and staff members. Serving is never a hindrance nor a burden. "To see the joy and love in the face of these families makes it all worthwhile." Andi is also involved in prison ministry. "People who are hurt and broken, desperately need someone to show them love." She has found compassion and empathy from her own trials and challenges. Prison ministry allows her to share her own story, give hope and healing, and let them feel mercy and forgiveness, maybe for the first time. In her spare time, Andi enjoys snow skiing (always the athlete) and reading books that offer religious, spiritual insight. Her family belongs to St. Kieran Catholic Church in El Cajon.
