When our beloved new president, Andi, invited me to serve as the your governing board's Spiritual Director, I was surprised, humbled, honored and delighted all at same time! Now I'm praying that I'm worthy to fulfill this job and that the Holy Spirit guides me through it while fulfilling my duties, so here goes...

Upon sitting down to write this article I noticed the many deep, long shadows dancing in the breeze outside my windows. A quick glance at the calendar's date of December 21streminded me why. It was the winter solstice thereby making it the shortest day of the year. Although the days were growing shorter and we'd been having more darkness on a daily basis, the time for rejoicing was upon us because both the meaning and the message of Christmas brings eternal hope that never fades.
