LENTEN EVENING REFLECTION

FROM LIFE TO DEATH AND DEATH TO LIFE

This Lent, we invite you to answer
Christ's call to "get up, and walk" as
we contemplate: from Life to Death,
and from Death to Life.

We experience various kinds of death in our lives, and each death makes room for Christ in our hearts, giving birth to new life.



Sarah Crabtree, Mother of six
beautiful children, was born and
raised in East County, San Diego.
She will share how God's plan for
our life is infinite. Our choice to walk
with Him in faith will require death
in our life. How do we respond?
Contemplate this question as we
prepare our hearts for the
resurrection of our Savior, Jesus
Christ. and how His death brought
us new life.

In preparation for writing this article my prayer has been asking the Holy Spirit for direction as to the subject for reflection. With Lent rapidly approaching, the natural answer came to focus on this truly important Penitential, liturgical season.

"Lent" is an ancient word for spring, and as we well know is an period of six weeks when we prepare ourselves for the coming of the Paschal Mystery, the Easter event that forever changed history. As Bishop Barron so eloquently states, "During Lent we apprentice to Jesus in His 40-day sojourn in the desert...doing what He did there, facing what He faced there. The desert is a place of clarification when we have been stripped of the relatively trivial desires that preoccupy us, we can see, with somewhat disturbing clarity, who we essentially are and what most presently matters." It's also a time in our personal lives for us to be nourished, grow and flourish. During 40 days Jesus went through His own personal time of reflection and prayer. Like Him this is what we too are called to do as well. Jesus came into this world to share His life with us. He thought about His mission here on earth and made choices accordingly. With His Father's will in mind He was very intentional about His use of time, power and personal gifts. He sought to do the will of the Father and show us the way for all persons to be brothers and sisters so that we too might one day enter and dwell with the Father in heaven for all eternity.

In addition, Lent is a time of instruction for us and our faith comes to us by hearing, reading, study and good conversation. Our faith needs to grow and we need to ask questions and to reflect on the answers. To grow in faith calls for an alert and attentive person, one who listens to the Word of God, to others, to self, to one's speech, to one's conscience and also to the world. In this season, the Church uses the Word of God with an abundance of great themes of faith, conversion and turning back to God, who is already waiting and loving us. We are asked to do more because Lent is a time when we are also asked to look to scriptures and personally evaluate our lives and do penance and reconciliation. While writing this I had the good fortune to listen to Pope Francis address a million people gathered for the celebration of Mass at the Ndolo Airport on his Pilgrimage of Peace trip to the Democratic Republic of Congo. A statement he made that I'll never forget was, "May our sins be drown in the silence of Your mercy." What a profound and beautiful image this conjured up for me, one that truly speaks to my heart and I'll frequently be meditating on!

The Gospel during Lent is chosen each day in accordance with Lenten themes and preparation for baptism, penance, prayer, an effort to live a good Christian life, and to accept the mystery of Salvation through the cross. As Cale Clark from Relevant Radio says when speaking about scripture from the Bible, "Even though it's an old book, God can speak to us afresh every day." Recently, on the 4th Sunday of Ordinary Time in the Gospel of St. Matthew (5:1-12) we were presented with the Beatitudes from The Sermon on The Mount. This presents us (perhaps "afresh" to some) with "the attitude" of Christ and calls upon us once again to live our lives by following this code of conduct.

This got me to thinking that since Lent is a time for new life to appear, it's a good time for challenging oneself to more fully live out one or

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more of these Christ-like attitudes and or ask when and where do l tend to stray from the beatitudes? Such reflection might even shed light some of our old rigid or frozen attitudes making them more apparent and even helping us to modify them or even make them disappear. As the saying goes, sunlight is the best disinfectant!

It is said that a tree with deep roots can weather any storm. If we more fully sink our roots deep within our Catholic spirituality during our daily living, we should be able to weather any storm. In turn, we will also come to know the abundant life that Jesus invites us to experience both here and for all eternity...As Bishop Barron so eloquently says "With our eyes fixed on this coming Glory of Easter let us together enter into this desert time of self-denial ready to break out of the darkness of sin and death and into the light of the Risen Christ."

During this grace-filled season let us hear with our hearts and as Christ's true followers strive to truly let our lives shine forth as witnesses to the "be-attitudes" of Christianity.
