Happy Birthday Dearest Sisters!

In case you're wondering why I'm greeting you in this fashion, it's because I'm writing this on Pentecost Sunday, a very special liturgical day because it's the official birthday of our Catholic Church. This day marks the completion of the Paschal Mystery and as the Catechism of the Catholic Church explains, "...when the seven weeks of Easter have come to an end and Christ's Passover is fulfilled in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, manifested, given, and communicated as a divine person: of His fullness, Christ, the Lord, pours out the Spirit in abundance." Moreover, on this day the Holy Trinity is fully revealed!

In his most recent Pentecost Sunday homily, Bishop Barron stated that the Holy Spirit is equivalent to the power as well as the love that connects God the Father to God the Son. This love of God is the very force that gave rise to creation and is also the sustaining power of the universe. Without a doubt it is the most powerful force imaginable! Furthermore, many great saints have cooperated with the promptings of the Holy Spirit and by doing so have unleashed extraordinary power. For example, Pope John Paul II's cooperation led to an unleashing of power that undid the Soviet Union and the block of nations surrounding it. Also, tiny, little, St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta cooperated with the Holy Spirit and another great force was unleashed throughout the world by the wonderful works of the religious order she founded, the Missionaries of Charity. Similarly, Mother Angelica followed the promptings of the Holy Spirit and launched EWTN, the Eternal Word Television Network, which broadcasts daily, evangelizing throughout the world. Now, here in our corner of the world, let's consider how Whispering Wind's founders, Don Kojis and Jerry Tisi, responded to the Holy Spirit's prompt-

ings and acting upon them. Just look at what has transpired and how the camp has evolved into the amazing facility that it's become today. Obviously, cooperation with the Holy Spirit most certainly can and does produce outstanding results!

Speaking of our beloved camp, wasn't our recent WWWA Retreat. More to Your Story, an inspiring one? Among many other things, our own beautiful auxiliary sister and Camp Director of Ministry Development & Programs, Paula Bott, is an awesome speaker and storyteller. During the course of the retreat, she guided retreatants through a series of wonderful reflections on faith and the development of personal stories. So graced and spiritfilled, Paula shared how many blessed, as well as challenging personal experiences. shaped her life and personal faith journey. Like the saints mentioned above, Paula has also collaborated with God during her lifetime and handed her life over to Him, come what may. Despite some trying times, with God's assistance she's weathered storms, and has also been restored and renewed thereby allowing her to give witness to God's glorious mercies.

During our retreat, Paula spoke about Holy Moments and also gifted each retreatant with the little gem of a book, "Holy Moments". You set aside personal preference and self-interest, and for one moment you do what you prayerfully believe God is calling you to do." Wow! Ponder that... Daily, each and every moment, wherever we turn, we are faced with unending choices. Another noteworthy point about the role of the Holy Spirit was addressed by Pope Francis in the Pentecost Sunday homily he delivered today. This truly resonated with me because it conveyed how the role of the Holy Spirit is that of the Spirit of unity. From experience we know all to well that our efforts alone are not always sufficient to achieve harmony. The Holy Spirit opposes the spirit of division because He is harmony and the agent of peace. As a result. Pope Francis calls us to invoke the Holy Spirit daily upon our whole world, upon our lives and upon any kind of division. Doing so holds great importance in our world today!

The following quote from Mother Teresa expresses a great deal of wisdom and seems very likely that it may have been revealed to her by the Holy Spirit:

The fruit of the silence is prayer. The fruit of prayer is faith. The fruit of the faith is love. The fruit of love is service. The fruit of service is peace.

These statements seem to illuminate St. Mother Teresa's thought process and also reveal what influenced the choices that she made. She was known to say, "Let no one ever come to you without coming away better and happier." With such a goal in mind, one should have no problem creating unlimited Holy Moments... The remainder of our lives lie ahead, waiting for us with countless moments. Will we choose to make them Holy or unholy moments? The choice is ours to make, so we will be the ones determining the outcome of our stories.

My prayer for each of you is that the Holy Spirit continues guiding you as a disciple on a mission of collaboration with our awesome God in order to create amazing Holy Moments!

We prayed for him, and he had a miraculous surgery the following morning. We also witnessed the God wink of butterflies at our place settings moments before Paula shared the story about Natalie's connection to butterflies.



And, let's not forget how the Holy Spirit worked through Monsignor Mark Campbell, who blessed us with the sacrament of reconciliation on Saturday and Mass on Sunday. During his homily, he spoke about an ancient art form in Japan that used broken porcelain to recreate a vessel using gold as the glue. He used this as a metaphor for how we showed up broken and the Holy Spirit came in and filled our cracks with gold so we could shine His light as we left camp. Little did Monsignor realize that we had done an exercise moments before he arrived for Mass where we took broken glass, lined in gold/copper foil, and placed our fingerprints on each individual piece to make a mosaic of the Holy Spirit.
