Countless delightful and blessed hours were spent on family outings, activities and fun, including attending Family Camp at Whispering Winds with our son, his wife and their 5 children. The theme for this year was "Wacky Weekend! Discover the Crazy LOVE of God!" The accompanying scripture verse for the weekend was, Matthew 10:39, "Whoever loses his life for my sake will find it".

While the grandchildren were enjoying attending their respective programs, the adults were graced to hear the talks given by Deacon Kevin Helfers and his lovely wife, Yvette. One of the points mentioned in their talk was that we all need to share with one another because personal testimony builds faith, and oh my, what an amazing testimony the two of them presented! One special point emphasized was that we are all created in love and have a special purpose. God reaches out to us hoping that we will respond. We don't always recognize our own strengths and potential, but being in community helps us to see these and helps us to pursue them. Also, it goes without saying, the crazy, wacky love of God can move us in amazing ways!

When we allow ourselves to be vulnerable we feel the love of God and we are dignified because He has called us! He wants us to surrender and "be enough" because He will provide for us. He posed the question, "How much faith does one need?", and he responded by saying we need enough to remain faithful when the storms rage and the waves rise up around us as they did in this Gospel. However, when we do keep the faith and call out to the Lord in our times of need we can find the strength to press on through the difficulties. Furthermore, Fr. O'Connor went on to say that by following God's Holy will and promptings we might also empower others, thereby giving way to unexpected miracles.

Rising above the ashen and apocalyptic landscape the historic

Maria Lanakila Catholic Church remained standing! Founded in 1846, the appropriately named church, which in Hawaiian means "Victorious Mary" or "Our Lady of Victory", was completely unscathed!



Despite the adjacent Convent, parish hall, school and preschool all being incinerated around them, both the church and Rectory escaped the wrath of the flames. Moreover, two days later when Fr. Kuriakose Nadooparambil, the Pastor entered the church he was amazed to find that the flowers at the foot of the altar weren't withered from the extremely high temperatures that resulted from nearby flames. True to it's Mission Statement Lahaina's Maria Lanakila Catholic Church, inspired by the Holy Spirit and by the example of the patroness, Mary, Our Lady of Victory, is called to be a vibrant voice in the community and a beacon for the Catholic faith and sharing of the Gospel.

In contrast to Lahaina's phenomenal devastation, like a rainbow appearing after a storm, the fact that Maria Lanakila Church remains standing serves as a testament of God's loving mercy as well as a sign of hope for the future. As we hold in our hearts and prayers all of Maui's departed souls, those injured, missing, displaced and devastated, as well as all first responders and all of the extended families of these individuals, may God grant them the graces of strength, perseverance, comfort, and peace during this most difficult and trying of times. May we all also continue to find consolation in Matthew's 10:39 promise, "Whoever loses his life for my sake will find it."
