Saints in Training

Another crisp Fall morning's dawned, and as the Holy Spirit prompts and guides my key strokes, it's with great joy I'm composing this article. Yesterday was All Saints Day and today we're celebrating the Solemnity of All Souls. What a great blessing it is having these days set aside to honor and venerate, remember and reflect upon the lives of loved ones and those who've gone before us on life's pilgrimage to eternity. Unlike many who don't share in the observances of these Feast days, I feel so grateful to be Catholic and graced with having an understanding of the significance of these glorious days, as well as that of the Communion of Saints.

Saint comes from the Latin word sanctus. which means holy and apart. Such s e t Individuals were by no means perfect, but simply ordinary humans who've made it to their heavenly reward persevering in their efforts to be Christ's

followers. Rather than living "picture-perfect holiness", some Saints even lived a life that was quite the opposite. As recorded by Jesus in the Beatitudes, (Matthew 5:1-12), surprisingly many saints were like Him, and also lived as "revolutionaries" in their respective times because they behaved so differently from the accepted norms!

During an All Saints Day homily Santa Sophia's Pastor, Fr. Corey Tufford, posed the question, "How do you make Holy Water?" He quickly responded by going on to say, "You boil the hell out of it." That creates quite a visual doesn't it? Father then segued by describing how each of the saint statues adorning the colonnade in Vatican's St. Peter's Square, is depicted holding the instrument attributed to the cause of their death. Although martyrdom

isn't a prerequisite for sainthood, heroic measures or suffering ill fates often have occurred in the lives of individuals as they ventured toward sainthood.

In sharp contrast to the martyrdom of other saints, Pope Francis shared a bit of St. Mother Teresa's journey in his catechesis on the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time. He referred back to a moment in 1979, just after she had received the Nobel Peace Prize. When a reporter asked her if she had illusions about changing the world she replied, "Me no, I never thought I could change the world! I only wanted to be a drop of clean water, through which God's love could shine." Not always easy, the Pope went on to say that Christians

need to forget other things and take this first step and become this little drop of "holy water" in order to reflect the Father's love like mirrors. "This is how Mother Teresa, who was so little, was able to do so much good - by reflecting God's love just as would a little

drop. If at times, looking at her and other saints, we might be moved to think that they are heroes that cannot be imitated, let us think again about that small drop: love is a drop that can change many things.", the Pope concluded.

In one of his classic All Saints Day homilies Bishop Barron explained to be holy means to follow the will of God, to love, for that is what God is and what God is does. He went on to say that love is focused on mercy which is also what the love of God is. It follows then that a saint is one in whom God is alive and indwelling, and whose life is attuned to loving and expressing God's tender mercy. This is what makes a saint happy because they are able to be all that they were created by doing the will of God.

Many times it has been said, "Christians

are like tea bags; their strength is not drawn out until they are steeped in hot water!" Knowing that we're called to be saints seems like a tall order. However, we don't necessarily need to be martyrs, but simply to love and be merciful wherever we are located, right here and right now. Like Mother Teresa who simply wanted be a water droplet reflecting God's love, may we also do the same. Better still. like the fountain of water gushing forth on the Divine Mercy image, may we also be fonts of love and living water that also sprays about sprinkling droplets. May we all be reflections of God's love and mercy, inspiring and assisting others along this earthly pathway toward our glorious eternal heavenly reward!
